You will demonstrate the potentially devastating effects of stroke and why immediate care is invaluable in preventing the cruel outcomes of a stroke.

 Go to random.org and type in 100 as the upper bound. If your result ≤ 87, your patient sustained an ischemic stroke. Otherwise, a hemorrhagic stroke was experienced.

4. Explain the resulting signs shown by the patient and the symptoms experienced by the patient.
