Brain Attack: The devastating effects of strokes

Background

By this point, you have reviewed key brain structures, brain regions, and their associated functions. Additionally, we have reviewed the basic causes and signs of stroke. You should be able to explain the difference between ischemic and hemorrhagic strokes. You should also understand what is meant by BE FAST and why immediate action is so crucial. Now, you will synthesize all this knowledge to the creation of your own fictional case studies involving individuals who were unable to achieve adequate care in time. You will demonstrate the potentially devastating effects of stroke and why immediate care is invaluable in preventing the cruel outcomes of a stroke.

Directions

Using the case studies (signs, symptoms, and CT scan) provided by the other groups, identify the affected regions and the type of stroke.
